A RESOLUTION

ON THE DEATH OF HON. C. A. PIERCE.

1 Whereas, the Honorable Colwell A. Pierce, a
2 former member of the Arizona Senate, died October
3 5, 1954, in El Paso, Texas.

4 Mr. Pierce was born in 1886, at Pawtucket,
5 Rhode Island, and attended Missouri School of
6 Mines at Rolla, Missouri, from which institution
7 he received degrees of B. S. and E. M.

8 He came to Arizona in his youth and entered
9 into the mining business at Patagonia. Following
10 success in his chosen field of work he became
11 interested in public and fraternal affairs. He
12 was a member of the Masonic Fraternity.

13 His interest in state government led to his
14 being chosen in 1922 to represent Santa Cruz
15 County in the Senate of the Sixth Legislature.
16 He held the position of Chairman of the Committee
17 on Mines and Mining, and was a member of the

1 Committees on Appropriations, Labor, Livestock,
2 Roads, and Militia and Public Defense. He retired
3 from public life in Arizona to become general super-
4 intendant of the United States Potash Company at
5 Carlsbad, New Mexico.

6 He brought to his legislative work the high
7 degree of ability and painstaking effort that
8 always characterized him.

9 Therefore

10 Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Arizona:

11 1. The Senate has learned with deep regret of
12 the passing of the late Senator Colwell A. Pierce,
13 and extends condolences to the surviving members
14 of his family.
