

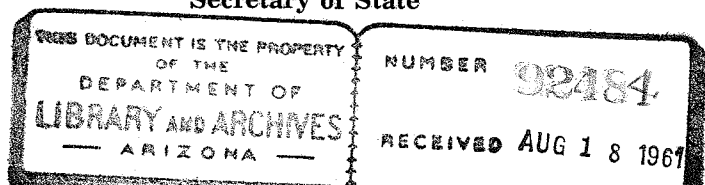

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 6

A RESOLUTION

ON THE DEATH OF THE HONORABLE
DOC FITZGERALD BENSON

The Honorable Doc Fitzgerald Benson passed away on October 22, 1960, in Phoenix, Arizona, at the age of sixty-eight years.

Doc Benson was born on September 4, 1892, in Leon County, Texas. He received his education in Texas and for two years attended Wiley College located at Marshall, Texas.

In 1933 Doc Benson came to Arizona. In 1937 Mr. Benson was elected President of the Arizona Chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. He served this organization for many years as President and as a member of its Board of Directors. Doc Benson was a leading force in the organization of the William Patterson Lodge of Elks and served two terms as its Exalted Ruler. Besides serving as the Exalted Ruler he was very active in the Lodge activities. Boy Scout activities also commanded the attention of the Honorable Doc Benson. He served as Committee Chairman of Boy Scout Troop 17.

The citizens of his legislative district acknowledged his outstanding leadership by electing him as a member of the House of Representatives of the Arizona Legislature. He served during the Twenty-first Legislature and was appointed to act on the Standing Committees of County and Municipal Affairs and Judiciary.

Doc Fitzgerald Benson distinguished himself in many other ways. He served as a Precinct Committeeman in Phoenix for many years. He was also one of the founders of the Wesley Methodist Church and was also President of the Church's Men's Club. Therefore

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Arizona:

That the members of the House of Representatives sincerely regret the passing of the Honorable Doc Fitzgerald Benson and do, therefore, extend condolences to his widow and other surviving members of his family.

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 7

A RESOLUTION

ON THE DEATH OF THE HONORABLE
HOWARD SPROUSE

The Honorable Howard Sprouse passed away on May 13, 1960, as a result of an automobile accident, at the age of sixty years.

Mr. Howard Sprouse was born on August 1, 1900, at Dripping Springs, Texas. As a child, in January, 1910, he was brought to the State of Arizona where he remained for the rest of his life.

The citizens of his legislative district honored Howard Sprouse by electing him to serve in the Eleventh Legislature. His service was as a member of the Arizona House of Representatives and in that capacity he was a member of several Standing Committees which included Capitol Buildings and Grounds, Efficient Government, Labor, and Petitions and Memorials. Therefore
