HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 12

A RESOLUTION

ON THE DEATH OF THE HONORABLE EDWARD LESTER JAMESON

On February 4, 1960, the Honorable Edward Lester Jameson passed away at the age of seventy-five years.

Mr. Jameson resided in the State of Arizona for over a half century and during those years he was dedicated in the service of his community and fellow citizens.

The Honorable Edward L. Jameson was born in Knox County, Nebraska. In 1910 he moved to Phoenix where he resided until 1928 when he moved to Kingman. Mr. Jameson was a partner with John Neal for over thirty years in the operation of the Long Mountain Ranch Company.

Mr. Jameson was honored by the citizens of his legislative district on five different occasions when they voted to have him represent their interests in the Arizona Legislature as a member of the House of Representatives. Edward Lester Jameson served in the Legislature for ten years and during the Eighteenth Legislature, his final term, he was elected as the Speaker of the House of Representatives. In this post he served with distinction.

Edward Lester Jameson, in addition to serving his State in a commendable manner, was also very active in community affairs. At one time he served as President of the Kingman Chamber of Commerce. In addition to this distinction, he was chosen Master of the Masonic Lodge, and served as a member of the Rotary Club and as advisor to the Rainbow Girls of the Masons. Moreover, Mr. Jameson was one of the organizers of the state-wide planning commission. Therefore

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Arizona:

That the members of the House of Representatives do sincerely regret the passing of the Honorable Edward Lester Jameson, a person who distinguished himself and served the citizens of Arizona for fifty years, and do, therefore extend condolences to his surviving relatives, and to Mr. and Mrs. John Neal with whom he lived for over thirty years.

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 13

A RESOLUTION

COMMEMORATING THE FOUNDING OF ARIZONA STATE UNIVERSITY AND CONGRATULATING THE UNIVERSITY ON ITS SEVENTY-FIFTH ANNIVERSARY

WHEREAS House Bill Number 164, introduced in the Thirteenth Legislature of the Territory of Arizona on February 26, 1885 by John Samuel Armstrong, Chairman of the House Education Committee, provided for the establishment of a Normal School which is now Arizona State University;

WHEREAS said bill was passed and signed into law by Governor F. A. Tritle on March 12, 1885, and Arizona State University begins the celebration of its Diamond Jubilee on March 12, 1960;

WHEREAS the citizens of Tempe in Maricopa County offered outstanding inducements including twenty acres of patented land, and cooperated so effectively that the institution, in less than one year after its founding, opened its doors for the academic year, 1885-1886 to twenty-three students on February 8, 1886;

WHEREAS Charles Trumbull Hayden, distinguished Founder of Tempe, was President of the original Board of Education;

WHEREAS the institution, under its Board of Education, nobly fulfilled the purposes prescribed, namely: "The instruction of persons in the art of teaching . . . also to give instruction in the mechanical arts and in husbandry, in agricultural chemistry, in the fundamental law of the United States and
