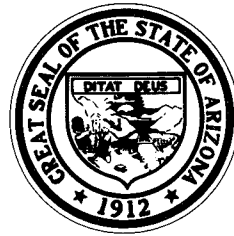

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 2015

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

APPROVING THE APPOINTMENT OF DOUGLAS R. NORTON AS AUDITOR GENERAL OF THE STATE OF ARIZONA.

Whereas, the Joint Legislative Budget Committee of the Legislature of the State of Arizona has reappointed Douglas R. Norton as Auditor General of the State of Arizona subject to approval by concurrent resolution of the Legislature pursuant to section 41-1279.01, Arizona Revised Statutes; and

Whereas, Mr. Norton is a certified public accountant certified to practice in this state and is subject to the standards and ethics of the accounting profession as regulated by the State Board of Accountancy; and

Whereas, Mr. Norton is eligible for reappointment as Auditor General.

Therefore

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Arizona, the Senate concurring:

That the members of the Legislature approve the reappointment of Douglas R. Norton as Auditor General of the State of Arizona.

Passed the House, March 26, 1987 by the following vote: 57 Ayes, 0 Nays, 3 Not Voting.

Passed the Senate, April 22, 1987 by the following vote: 29 Ayes, 0 Nays, 1 Not Voting.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ON THE DEATH OF THE HONORABLE SAM A. McCONNELL, JR.

The Honorable Sam A. McConnell, Jr. passed away at the age of sixty-two on July 21, 1986 in the City of Phoenix. At the time of his death Mr. McConnell was one of the most highly qualified legislators and was serving in his twentieth year as a member of the Arizona House of Representatives.

Representative McConnell was born in El Paso, Texas on January 7, 1924 and lived primarily in Indiana where he obtained a Bachelor of Science Degree from Butler University before coming to Arizona in 1950. He was a registered Pharmacist and drugstore owner and operator in Williams, Arizona for many years.

Known as an outstanding legislative technician and an astute political strategist, Representative McConnell was considered by his fellow legislators as a leading expert on Department of Economic Security, health, medical and monetary issues. During his ten terms in the Legislature he served on the Health and Welfare, Appropriations, Counties, Human Resources, Banking and Insurance, Transportation, Judiciary, Natural Resources, Commerce, Government Operations, Rules and Joint Legislative Budget Committees and Legislative Council. Mr. McConnell served several terms as Speaker Pro Tem of the House of Representatives and a decade as Chairman of the House Rules Committee.

On the national level, Mr. McConnell served several terms as a member of the President's Advisory Committees on Medicare and Medicaid. He was also President of the National Association of Retail Druggists and served several terms on the Association's executive committee.

Perhaps he will be remembered best by many of his constituents for his unassuming admonition to call him "Sam" rather than Representative or Mr. McConnell.

Sam will be missed by his family, his friends, the Legislature and the people of the State of Arizona.

Therefore

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Arizona, the Senate concurring:

That the members of the Legislature sincerely regret the passing of the Honorable Sam A. McConnell, Jr. and extend their most sincere sympathies and condolences to his wife, Norma, his sons, Sam III and Michael, their wives and families and his other surviving relatives.
