HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 2026

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ON THE DEATH OF THE HONORABLE FRANK McELHANEY.

The Honorable Frank McElhaney passed away at the age of sixty-nine on December 7, 1985 in the City of Tempe. At the time of his death Mr. McElhaney was serving his fifth term in the Arizona House of Representatives.

He was born in south Phoenix and raised in Cashion where his parents, Randolph H. and Janet McElhaney, lived and farmed until 1926 when they moved to Wellton.

Mr. McElhaney was engaged in farming in the Wellton area of south central Yuma County for over fifty years and was a longtime leader in his community. He was one of the founders of the Presbyterian Church of Wellton and was elected as one of the first Elders of the Church. He served as a member of the Wellton School Board, was vice-president of the State Farm Bureau, was a member of the State Board of Directors of the Soil Conservation Service and was a National Resource Conservation Supervisor. Mr. McElhaney was President of the State Flying Farmers, a member of the Aircraft Pilots Association, the Arizona and Yuma Boards of Realtors and the Yuma Elks Club. He served for eight years as Justice of the Peace for the Wellton area.

In 1973 Mr. McElhaney was appointed by Governor Williams to represent District 5 in the Arizona House of Representatives and was first elected to serve in 1979.

Known as an extremely conscientious and diligent legislator, he served as a member of the Appropriations, Agriculture, Natural Resources and Energy and Public Institutions Committees.

He will be missed by his family, his friends and the people of the State of Arizona.

Therefore

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Arizona, the Senate concurring:

That the members of the Legislature sincerely regret the passing of the Honorable Frank McElhaney and do, therefore, extend their most sincere sympathies and condolences to his wife, Lucille, his daughters, Judy, Wanda, Ginny and Frankie, and his other surviving relatives.
