A RESOLUTION

ON THE DEATH OF HONORABLE S. P. MORGAN.

1 Whereas, Honorable S. P. Morgan, a member, in
2 1929, of the House of Representatives from Pinal
3 County, of the Ninth Legislature, passed away on
4 March 21, 1953, at the Hoemake Hospital, in Casa
5 Grande, after an illness extending over a period
6 of several years.

7 Mr. Morgan, a native of Mississippi and a
8 resident of Arizona since 1913, was an outstand-
9 ing citizen and contributor to the progress of
10 Pinal County and of Arizona. Directly connected
11 with the advancement of the farming, business and
12 educational interests of his community, he took an
13 active part in the development of water for farming,
14 was actively connected with the promotion of the
15 Coolidge Dam, organized the Casa Grande Valley Bank,
16 and served as a member of the board which planned
17 and built a high school for the town of Casa Grande.

1. In the Ninth Legislature Mr. Morgan served
2 with earnestness and efficiency as a member of
3 the Committee on Agriculture and Irrigation,
4 Accounting and Business Methods, and Ways and
5 Means, and was the author of a number of im-
6 portant measures. Therefore
7 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of
8 the State of Arizona:

9 1. The deep regret of the members of this
10 body for the passing of this patriotic pioneer and
11 developer of Arizona is hereby expressed, and their
12 sympathy extended to the bereaved widow and other
13 relatives of the deceased.
