A RESOLUTION

ON THE DEATH OF HON. LOUISE A MOORE.

1 Whereas, death~~has~~ summoned the Honorable
2 Louise A. Moore, a former member of the Arizona
3 House of Representatives, on September 28, 1954,
4 in the City of Los Angeles, California, at the
5 age of seventy-one years.

6 A native of Rockland in the State of Texas,
7 Mrs. Moore attended El Paso High School in El
8 Paso, Texas. Later, she was enrolled at Texas
9 State Normal in Huntsville, Texas, and there
10 received her teacher's certificate. Thereafter,
11 she moved to the State of Arizona, where she has
12 lived since 1915.

13 In 1940, the people of her legislative dis-
14 trict in Maricopa County, gave recognition to
15 her judgement and public spirit by electing her
16 to serve in the House of Representatives of the
17 Fifteenth Legislature. She served on the Banking

1 and Insurance, Child Welfare, Education, and
2 Public Institutions Committees. In her legis-
3 lative work, she was conscientious and displayed
4 a sense of duty that distinguished her every
5 activity. Therefore

6 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives
7 of the State of Arizona:
