A Concurrent Resolution

On the death of Morris Goldwater

Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Arizona, the House of Representatives concurring:

- 1 Whereas, on April 11, 1939, death removed Morris
- 2 Goldwater from his beloved Arizona; and
- 3 Whereas, the spirit of this revered pioneer, who de-
- 4 voted seventy-two years of his life to this state, can never
- 5 leave Arizona nor be forgotten by any Arizonian; and
- 6 Whereas, Mr. Goldwater's abiding faith in the destiny
- 7 of Arizona will forever stand as an example to those who
- 8 follow; and
- 9 Whereas, the deceased during his life was universally
- 10 recognized as one of Arizona's most distinguished, cap-
- 11 able, and illustrious builders, who contributed inestim-
- 12 ably to the civic, business, and social development of the
- 13 territory and state; and
- 14 Whereas, the state of Arizona is infinitely better for
- 15 having had the public services of the deceased, who gen-
- 16 erously gave of his time as mayor of Prescott, as county
- 17 supervisor, as member of the twelfth territorial council
- 18 and president of the twentieth territorial council, as
- 19 vice-president of the constitutional convention of
- 20 1910, and as a member of the senate of the second legisla-
- 21 ture, all of which offices he filled admirably, contributing
- 22 notably to the organic and statutory law of Arizona,
- 23 therefore

1 Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Arizona, the
2 House of Representatives concurring:

3 1. This body, while mourning the passing of Morris
4 Goldwater, records the belief of all citizens that his
5 spirit and his good works can never die, but will forever
6 live in the memory of the people.

7 2. The sympathy of the people of Arizona, through
8 their legislative representatives, is extended to the be-
9 reaved relatives of the deceased.
